# SOUTHEAST BRAZIL

# 2 – 23 October 2021

## LEADER: EDUARDO PATRIAL

Here we are again with another very successful Southeast Brazil Tour, scanning minutely the best and richest corners of the highly threatened Atlantic Forest, from northern Espirito Santo south to Paraná state (reformulated itinerary). The combination of the coastal lowlands and diffents parts of the hills from the Serra do Mar, provided us a large number of Brazilian endemics (97), over a hundred and twenty Atlantic Forest endemics and a long list with over 450 species (461). There was some rainy days but in general, the weather was good and the trip flowed nicely and smooth. There were special birds and moments at every site visited; I can easily remember most of the highlights, such as Solitary Tinamou, Black-fronted Piping Guan, Red-billed Curassow, Spot-winged Wood Quail, Pygmy and Long-trained Nightjars, Saw-billed and Minute Hermits, Frilled and Festive Coquettes, Green-crowned and Purple-crowned Plovercrests, Red-and-white Crake, Giant Snipe, Black and Black-and-white Hawk-Eagles, White-necked Hawk, Black-capped and Long-tufted Screech Owls, Tawny-browed Owl, Three-toed Jacamar, Buff-bellied Puffbird, Saffron and Spot-billed Toucanets, Mottled Piculet, Helmeted and Robust Woodpeckers, Blue-bellied Parrot, Red-tailed Amazon, Ochre-marked

and White-eared Parakeets, Scaled Woodcreeper, Pale-browed Treehunter, Araucaria Tit-Spinetail, Orangeeyed Thornbird, Itatiaia Spinetail, Salvadori's, Black-hooded, Serra and Marsh Antwrens, Rufous-backed Antvireo, White-bearded, Large-tailed, Tufted and Spot-backed Antshrikes, six endemics *Drymophila* Antbirds, White-bibbed and Squamate Antbirds, three *Chamaeza* Antthrushes, Variegated and Speckle-breasted (the two races) Antpittas, Black-cheeked Gnateater, Spotted Bamboowren, Slaty Bristlefront, White-breasted, Marsh and Mouse-colored Tapaculos, endemics *Phylloscartes* Tyrannulets, endemics *Hemitriccus* Tody/Bamboo Tyrants, Russet-winged Spadebill, Hooded and Black-headed Berryeaters, Swallow-tailed and Black-and-gold Cotingas, Bare-throated Bellbird, Sharpbill, Buff-throated Purpletuft, Brazilian Laniisoma, some amazingly colorful Tanagers and many more.

The journey started in the morning of October 2 at Vitória, capital of Espirito Santo state. After meeting at the airport, we spent the rest of morning not far in the municipality of Serra, at an uncommon rock outcrop near the village of Pitanga (Ouro Velho Restaurant), where we enjoyed splendid views of the Brazilian endemic Pygmy Nightjar (*vielliardi*), followed by a nice and local rural lunch. Other birds in the site include Aplomado Falcon, Band-tailed Hornero, Masked Water Tyrant, Amazon Kingfisher, Guira and Squirrel Cuckoos, Picazuro Pigeon, Chopi Blackbird and distant Peach-fronted Parakeets. Then an hour drive took us to Aracruz to spend another hour or so checking the feeders from the Estação Biologica Marinha Augusto Ruschi, the best site for the localised Minute Hermit. Besides the great looks at different individuals, we also have Glitering-throated Emerald, Swallow-tailed Hummingbird, few Blue-chinned Sapphire, loads of Red-legged Honeycreeper and the beautiful endemic primate Geoffroy's Marmoset. Then the rest of the day was northwards on the road, this time to reach our simple hotel in the town of Sooretama for dinner and overnight (due the pandemic, our usual place to bird and stay, the VALE Reserve, was closed for maintenance).

October 3<sup>rd</sup>. To replace the visit to VALE Reserve, we got the option of visitng the good Fazenda Cupido, which offers forest access attached to the reserve, just not as comprehensive as the options at VALE. Nevertheless, we did managed a nice day at Cupido despite the drought in the region, starting the early morning with great views of the threatened endemic Red-billed Curassow, male and female. At this site edge of forest provided Sooretama Slaty Antshrike, Campo Troupial and East Brazilian Pygmy Owl. Later we visited the garden and orchard of the headquarters, a quite good area for parrots and parakeets. There we had Orange-winged Amazon, endemic White-eared Parakeet, Black-necked Aracari, a brief Channel-billed Toucan (ariel) and the beautifiul Atlantic version of Turquoise Tanager (White-bellied T). Rest of morning was on the main trail in the tall forest, being quite productive with Rufous-tailed Jacamar, great views of the uncommon Olivaceous Flatbill, Brown-winged Schiffornis, Lesser and Plain-winged Woodcreepers, Red-crowned Ant-Tanager, Silveryflanked Antwren, Blond-crested Woodpecker, Ringed Woodpecker (tinnunculus), Cream-colored Woodpecker (subflavus) and the localized endemic Ochre-marked Parakeet. No signs of manakins and Black-headed Berryeater despite all the attempts, perhaps habitats were just too dry for them. Lunch was at Cupido and we covered more tracks in forest for the afternoon session, which was very quiet. From a clearing, we got good scope views of Blue-headed Parrot (reichenowi), and later in forest, a nice male Black-cheeked Gnateater and another couple of Red-billed Curassow. Evening night birding provided a responsive Tawny-browed Owl.

October 4<sup>th</sup>. Back to Fazenda Cupido for a final early morning session before heading to the hills. We covered the area of headquarters again, mainly for chances of parrots. Unfortunately, this time we only heard the endemic Red-browed Amazon distantly. Nevertheless, our time there was quite good with a long sighting of the shy endemic White-necked Hawk, plus better views of the subspecies Blue-headed Parrot and Channelbilled Toucan and Orange-winged Amazon, White-eared Parakeets and Black-necked Aracari again. The foest entrance still offered another pair Red-billed Curassow and the Atlantic ssp of Yellow-throated Woodpecker (*erythropis*). That was it for the first area of the trip. Then from Cupido we drove south and inland a bit to reach the hilly forests of Santa Teresa, which are usually very birdy. Entering Santa Teresa by late morning, we had our usual stop in private forest along a hilly dirt road, a nice site where we easily got the localized Wied's Tyrant-Manakin and some other nice birds - Black-throated Grosbeak, Yellow-lored Tody-Flycatcher, endemic Serra Antwren, Surucua Trogon (*aurantius*), Black Hawk Eagle and a responsive Black-capped Foliage-gleaner. After lunch in town, we finally checked-in the lovely Pousada Vita Verde where hummingbirds abound, no doubt one of the best spots in Brazil to enjoy hummingbirds. In couple of minutes, we saw 12 species: Sombre Hummingbird, Versicolored and Sapphire-spangled Emeralds, the stunning and major species Frilled Coquette, Rufous-breasted, Planalto and Scale-throated Hermits, Violet-capped Woodnymph, Swallow-tailed Hummingbird, Black Jacobin, Amethyst Woodstar and White-throated Hummingbird. Later in the afternoon, we visited the private forest again. There we got very close views of a male White-bibbed Antbird and surprisingly just few more records like a shy Streak-capped Antwren, Plain Xenops and Blue Manakin. Being so quiet, we decided to finish daylight in the gardem of Vita Verde, the best we did as we got very nice scope looks at East Brazilian Chachalaca.

October 5<sup>th</sup>. On this day, we had time to enjoy a full morning of birding at Santa Teresa. We started with some hummer, garden and fruit feeder. Hummers were still slow but we added Brazilian Ruby. The Chachalaca was seen again and few more birds at the fruit – Violaceous Euphonia, Golden-chevroned and Ruby-crowned Tanagers. Back to our private forest site, it was quiet in general; we found Swallow-winged Puffbird, Streak-capped Antwren, Sharpbill, Black-tailed Myiobius and Plain-winged Woodcreeper. We finish our morning in Santa Teresa this time visiting the important Reserva Biológica Augusto Ruschi, where roadside birding through the forest is available now. We had a fun time there despite the low bird activity. Nice views of Black-and-white Hawk-Eagle, Chestnut-crowned Becard, Spot-billed Toucanet, endemic Oustalet's Tyrannulet, Rufous-headed and Gilt-edged Tanagers; Blue Dacnis and Small-headed Elaenia. Later issues with our vehicle took us to change it in Vitoria. The rest of the day was on the road back to hills, further south in Espirito Santo, to reach in the early evening our hotel in Vargem Alta, in the Mata de Caetes area (the usual stay at Hotel Monte Verde was under maintenance due the pandemic).

October 6<sup>th</sup> was a very special day on this tour, the day we visited for the first time the Reserva Caetés, a reserve specially created to protect the rarest Cherry-throated Tanager (an area linked to the forest where we used to go in the previous years). The best part was getting the whole Cherry-throated Tanager family right after coming outside from the vehicle in the forest, just insane, great views of the couple feeding with the youngsters. The weather was misty and with a very light drizzle, but happily, that did not interfer us to see some other good birds that morning: Yellow-legged Thrush, Rufous Gnateater, endemics Cinnamon-vented Piha, Hooded Berryeater, Spot-breasted Antvireo, Ferruginous and Ochre-rumped Antbirds, Brassy-breasted and Gilt-edged Tanagers; Greenish Shiffornis, Rough-legged Tyrannulet, Channel-billed and Green-billed Toucans; the shy endemic Cryptic Antthrush and many others were heard. After lunch and a noon break at hotel, we had a session back at Caetes Reserve. Spix's Spinetail and Scale-throated Hermit provided a great show by the road before we get the reserve. The forest was quiet and already quite dark, where we saw Lesser and Olivaceous Woodcreepers, Blue Manakin and White-necked Thrush. Staying until dusk rewarded us with superb close views of the impressive male Long-trained Nightjar.


October 7<sup>th</sup>. Our very successful time at Reserva Caetés gave us the opportunity on this day to explore a few corners of the rich Águia Branca Private Reserve (area linked to Hotel Monte Verde) in the same area. First in the morning, we enjoyed the great show of the Swallow-tailed Cotingas that gathered every year to nest in the area. We got great views of diffent pairs in the sparse trees and exotic pine trees in the nearby golf course. A pair of Crested Becard was in the place too. Later we covered good forest on a slope, where we got the endemic Scaled Woodcreeper, more Swallow-tailed Cotinga, Long-tailed Tyrant, the colorful Yellow-fronted Woodpecker, Laughing Falcon, Rufous-thighed Kite, Black Hawk Eagle, endemic Half-collared Sparrow, Wing-barred Piprites, endemic White-breasted Tapaculo and the tricky Spotted Bamboowren. That was the morning. In the afternoon, we covered more forest at Águia Branca, the only site to try Rio de Janeiro Antbird and the entrance of the waterfall trail nearby. Unfortunately, Rio de Janeiro Antbird did not even call back this time. On the other hand, we had a great encounter with a roosting Ocellated Poorwill, plus Ochre-faced Tody-flycatcher, Green-barred Woodpecker, another Half-collared Sparrow, White-throated Woodcreeper and a really nice and lucky surprise, a roosting Long-tailed Potoo (nominate) which was low and very close to the track.

We completed Espirito Santo state successfully. We saw many great birds during the three main areas visited in the state. Below some of the photographed species (Eduardo Patrial):







October 8<sup>th</sup>. We left Espirito Santo early in the morning and headed southwards to Rio de Janeiro state, more precisely to reach the base of Serra dos Órgãos at the lovely Reserva Ecológica Guapiaçu, the REGUA. It as a quite long drive and we arrived at REGUA around 13:30. There we checked in and went for a plesant afternoon session around the wetlands. There we saw plenty Common Gallinule and Western Cattle Egret, also Masked Water Tyrant, Boat-billed Heron, White-headed Marsh Tyrant, Chestnut-capped Blackbird, Anhinga, Yellow-chinned Spinetail, Greater Ani, endemic Brazilian Tanager, White-barred Piculet, Yellow-backed Tanager, Rufescent Tiger Heron and Black-bellied Whistling Duck. Later, we covered more of open habitats (including the large marsh in the end of the day) nearby but outside the reserve. We got Lemmon-chested Greenlet, Swallow Tanager, endemic Long-billed Wren, and a large flock of White-collared Swift flying very low, also Sooty Swift, the stunning Streamer-tailed Tyrant and the impressive Giant Snipe at dusk (two in flight, good views!). Returning to REGUA, we still got great looks at Black-capped Screech Owl at a forest edge site, end of the day.

October 9<sup>th</sup> was a full day in the domains of REGUA. A female Frilled Coquette was feeding on flowers in lodge's garden before we go out. It was drizzling that morning and we did part of the beautiful Waterfall Trail in the dense foothill forest. Quiet in general and mostly because of the weather. In open habitats on our way we had Cobalt-rumped Parrotlet (Blue-winged P) and Burrowing Owl. The proper trail provided endemics Unicolored Antwren and White-necked Hawk; Southern Antpipit, Red-ruffed Fruitcrow, Lesser Woodcreeper, Silvery-flanked Antwren, Channel-billed Toucan and some others heard. We dipped on attempts for Brazilian Laniisoma at the lower known territories along the trail. In the afternoon, we covered the Waldenoor Track, also on the foothills. Not much exciting at this stage, there was Streaked Xenops, a male Sooretama Slaty Antshrike, Yellow-backed and Green-headed Tanagers, Crested Becard, Orange-bellied and Chestnut-bellied Euphonias and Pale-breasted Thrush. From there we visited the big marsh (Giant Snipe site), where the target Ash-throated Crake cooperated with great sightings. We still had the last hour light to enjoy the wetlands and the usual suspects.

October 10<sup>th</sup> was a tough wet day. We started very early, leaving REGUA to spend the day uphill in Nova Friburgo and with a visit to Carmo. First stop near Nova Friburgo, still early, happened at thousand meters of elevation at the Theodoro Trail. Luckily, we had a break on the rain by that time so we went straight after our target down the trail, the rare Brazilian Laniisoma, which promptly approached after playback for spectacular views, incredible! We heard some other nice birds and we quickly saw Azure-shouldered Tanager and a male Slaty Bristlefront. After that, we were on our way to Pico da Caledônia when we decided to do first the visit to Carmo for the rest of the morning; the rain in Nova Friburgo was too strong. At the usual Carmo's forest patch, which was also quite wet, our main target Three-toed Jacamar gave quite a work, we only found a pair in the forest deep on the track. Other birds seen at Carmo include Brown-crested Flycatcher, Campo Flicker, Chestnut-vented Conebill, Rufous-headed Tanager, White-barred Piculet and Hangnest Tody-Tyrant. We also heard Yellow-eared Woodpecker and Serra Antwren in the area. Back to Nova Friburgo and to more rain, we did our check in at hotel and decided to visit the good forest nearby at Macaé de Cima instead of trying the higher Caledônia. Weather was not good at all but at least we managed some goodies: excellent looks at Bertoni's Antbird, male White-bearded Antshrike (eye level views) and a close group of stunning Brassy-breasted Tanager. We finished the day heading back to hotel in Nova Friburgo.

October 11<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, the same bad weather that early morning in VF. We went up the Caledônia anyway. Main target, endemic Grey-winged Cotinga only called distantly few times. In the rainy conditions up there, we still managed nice views of endemics Bay-chested Warbling Finch, more Brassy-breasted Tanager, Diademed Tanager and guaranteed our chances with the other restricted-range cotinga, the fascinating Black-and-gold Cotinga. Back to the hotel by mid morning for breakfast and departure to Itatiaia National Park, in southern Rio de Janeiro state. A lot of rain on our way and at Itatiaia, where we arrived by mid-afternoon. At the nice Hotel do Ypê (low part of the NP) we could at least enjoyed the feeders and garden for the rest of that wet day. We saw Brazilian Ruby (males and females), Black Jacobins, Violet-capped Woodnymph, Versicolored Emerald, Scale-throated Hermit, endemic Olive-green Tanager, Ruby-crowned, Golden-chevroned and Green-headed Tanagers, Double-collared Seedeater, tame Dusky-legged Guans and White-eyed Parakeets.

October 12<sup>th</sup> was fortunately a beautiful day visiting the high part of Itatiaia National Park, the amazing Agulhas Negras Road (birding from 1800m to 2400m more or less). We got early to Agulhas Negras, making a first stop in the first kilometers. The forest was very active and at this first corner, we managed to see the endemics Rufous-backed Antvireo and Serra do Mar Tyrannulet, plus Golden-winged Cacique and a cooperative pair of the rare Black-capped Piprites. Then much further going up the road, the fascinating males Green-crowned Plovercrest were at their usual lekking spot. Same site provided endemics Buff-throated and Bay-chested Warbling Finches and good looks at Olivaceous Elaenia. About two hundred meters up on the road, another bunch of birds (closely watched) next the viewpoint from the bridge - Diademed, Brassy-breasted and Fawnbreasted Tanagers, Mottle-cheeked and Greenish Tyrannulets and the specialist Drymophila Rufous-tailed antbird. Time on a short side trail put us with great observations of the shy Speckled-breasted Antpitta (the northern version of it, endemic to the highlands of SE Brazil). From there we drove up to reach the paramolike habitat. At a first incursion, we saw well the localized Itatiaia Spinetail, the impressive Large-tailed Antshrike and a nice Thick-billed Saltator. Another endemic found going up the road, a couple Velvety Black Tyrant. We entered the National Park's gate and did a short strectch of a trail in that spectacular habitat and place. There we got excellent views of more Itatiaia Spinetail, our main target, the locally rare endemic Greybacked Tachuri and unbelievable close sighting of Mouse-colored Tapaculo. From the top, we drove down for a snack at the Agulhas Negras' entrance and later we finished our time at Agulhas Negras at its first kilometers, achieving endemics Serra do Mar Tyrant-Manakin and our second Chamaeza Rufous-tailed Antthrush. Back to National Park's low part, there was a bit a drizzle while we covered bamboo forest at Hotel Donati. There we got good views of the endemic Fork-tailed Tody-Tyrant. Then the day was finished back at our place Hotel do Ypê, where we saw very well about four Blue-winged Macaws.

October 13<sup>th</sup>. We left Itatiaia National Park early in the morning and drove down the Serra do Mar to reach the coast in southern Rio de Janeiro state. More precisely in Perequê, a district of Agra dos Reis, we arrived around 8:30 to bird the forests of the Mambucaba valley. There we went straight to our site for the main target bird, the local and threatened Black-hooded Antwren. Amazingly, in few minutes we had both male and female at very close sight, and Lemmon-chested Greenlet and Brazilian Tanager. From the antwren site, we visited two other very forest sites the Mambucaba area that morning. The first one provided great views of Sao Paulo Tyrannulet, a pair of the uncommon Buff-bellied Puffbird, Orange-eyed Thornbird, Rufous-tailed Jacamar and another male Black-hooded Antwren. Later in the second area we got Blond-crested and Yellow-fronted Woodpeckers, Green-headed and Red-necked Tanagers, a pair of the tiny endemic Buff-throated Purpletft, White-bearded Manakin, Rufous-capped Antthrush, endemics Pale-browed Treehunter and the stunning male Squamate Antbird. From the Mambucaba we continued our way to Ubatuba in the northern coast of São Paulo state, with a quick small lunch in Paraty. Finally in Ubatuba and after hotel check in, we were able to visit the fantastic Sitio Folha Seca of Mr. Jonas, another paradise for hummingbirds and lowland Atlantic Forest birding. We had a pleasant time at Folha Seca, as usual, with many Saw-billed Hermit, amazing Festive Coquettes, Brazilian Ruby, Violet-capped Woodnymph, White-chinned Sapphire, Sombre Hummingbird, Black Jacobin, Versicolored Emerald, Black-throated Mango, Amethyst Woodstar, Green-headed Tanager, Violaceous, and Chestnut-bellied Euphonias. To finish the day a walk in the forest provided close looks at a male Slaty Bristlefront. Overnight in Ubatuba.

It is true that we had a few wet days in Rio de Janeiro state, but definitely, our passage through was very rewaring in terms of birds, achieving most of the endemics and target species. The following pages show some of the photos taken (Eduardo Patrial):

October 14<sup>th</sup>. We had a nice morning at Angelim Raiforest (private reserve) in Ubatuba this day. The birding was quite productive in dense foothill forest. Targeting new records, we got male and female Sooty Grassquit, the rare Buffy-and Temminck's Seedearters (seeding bamboo), endemic Scaled Antbird, Riverbank Warbler and the rare Salvadori's Antwren (mixed flock with Red-crowned Ant-Tanager). In addition, we saw plenty other lovely AF species, such as Ferruginous and Bertoni's Antbird, Black-capped Foliage-gleaner, Spotbreasted Antvireo, Golden-chevroned Tanager, endemic Orange-eyed Thornbird and another pair of Buff-throated Purpletuft, this one collecting nesting material. It was a very nice morning indeed. Unfortunately, in the afternoon we had more issues regarding our vehicle, but all solved until the end of that day. Lovely dinner and overnight at Ubatuba Palace hotel.

October 15<sup>th</sup>. On this day, we transferred ourselves to Guarulhos for a one-night stay, before we head to the famous Intervales State Park. We left Ubatuba very early, going up the hills for a first birding stop at the good area of Serra do Mar State Park (Santa Virgínia). Our main target cooperated nicely, a smart male Dusky-tailed Antbird. Plenty more was heard in the area and we saw a couple more like Grey-hooded Attila, Serra do Mar Tyrant-Manakin, Yellow-legged Thrush, Cliff Flycatcher and Diademed Tanager. Later in the morning, next to Taubaté, we made another quick stop in open habitat, where we had Firewood Gatherer andYellow-rumped Marshbird. From there, still in the morning, we continued driving to reach our birding site near São José dos Campos, a great place to see the threatened and local Marsh (Sao Paulo) Antwren. We got close views of male and female this time. Other cool thing there was seeing Orange-breasted and Orange-eyed Thornbirds side by side, a very diagnostical sighting. From there, we continued south to Guarulhos where we went straight to the forested hills of Serra da Cantareira State Park in the afternoon for our last birding session that day. It was as our usual visits to the park, not long but productive. There we got nice looks at our main target species, the uncommon Southern Bristle Tyrant and, surprisingly this time, an Eastern Slaty Thrush

right next to the parking area. Buff-fronted Foliage-gleaner, Rufous-bellied and Pale-breasted Thrushes, Sayca Tanager and a few more were noticed. Back to the hotel in Guarulhos for a rest and overnight.


October 16<sup>th</sup>. Morning drive south of São Paulo to the famous Intervales State Park. Park's entrance road by late morning provided some good birds with few stops along it. We got White-eared Puffbird, a pair of Greythroated Warbling Finch, Azure-shouldered Tanager, Ochre-collared Piculet, Orange-headed Tanager, Burnished-buff Tanager, Araucaria Tit-Spinetail and a male Bare-throated Bellbird when arriving the guesthouse just before the park's gate. After lunch at park's restaurant, we met our excellent local guide Betinho for the afternoon session. The weather suddenly changed to cloudy and drizzly, but not enough bad to disturb our great start at Intervales. We started with great views of the well-trained Red-and-white Crake around the headquarters, going later for roadside birding near the Guapiara gate, where we got birds like Uniform Finch, the amazing Purple-crowned Plovercrest, Grey-bellied Spinetail and Serra do Mar Tyrant-Manakin. Back to the headquarters, we visited the ground-birds feeding station, where we got close and long looks at Solitary Tinamouprovided. We still had Shear-tailed Grey Tyrant near the research station before checking a little marsh outside the park. There we saw Green and Buff-necked Ibises, Crested Oropendola, Chestnut-capped Blackbird and a very cooperative Blackish Rail to finish the day.

October 17<sup>th</sup> was a very productive first day at Intervales, despite the thin drizzle for most of the day. We started the morning with close views of Spot-winged Wood Quails and Solitary Tinamou at the feeding station. Later the famous Carmo Road took the rest of the morning with sightings of White-browed Foliage-gleaner, endemic Brown Tanager, Saffron Toucanet, Bay-ringed Tyrannulet, Rufous-tailed Attila, the rare and most wanted Helmeted Woodpecker, White-bearded Antshrike, Maroon-bellied and Plain Parakeets, Ochrebreasted Foliage-gleaner, Plain Antvireo, Euler's Flycatcher, Black-throated Trogon, Short-tailed Antthrush (our third *Chamaeza*), endemic Hooded Berryeater, Trilling Gnatwren, White-collared Foliage-gleaner, White-shouldered Fire-eye and the rare Black-fronted Piping Guan. Back to the headquarters for lunch, we also enjoyed a roosting pair Tropical Screech Owl. The afternoon was quite rainy; we walked part of the viewpoint trail, spotting another group of much shyer Spot-winged Wood Quails. In the Pica-pau clearing, we had a Rufous-thighed Hawk, and some of the usual tanagers and thrushes. The very nice end came in the forest next to the hill Monte Rosa, where after working patiently we managed decent views of Variegated Antpitta.

October 18<sup>th</sup>. It was another drizzly day at Intervales. For the morning session, we did the downhill walk to the beautiful Lajeado valley, which started with remarkable sightings of Short-tailed Antthrush. Walkind down the track we found White-browed Foliage-gleaner, Scalloped Woodcreeper, Red-ruffed Fruitcrow, Rufousbreasted Leaftosser, Blue Manakin, Olivaceous and Lesser Woodcreepers, White-necked Thrush and Sepiacapped Flycatcher. Down at the valley's bottom, we managed superb looks at the rare Russet-winged Spadebill, one of the main target birds in the area. Still at the bottom, we had Scale-throated Hermit, Palebrowed Treehunter (*holti*) and a male of the rare endemic Atlantic Royal Flycatcher (it raised its crest for a second!). The walk back provided another blessed present, a female Helmeted Woodpecker watched for a long time, feeding on trees just beside the trail, what a treat. There was nice views of Grey-hooded and Rufoustailed Attilas, more White-browed Foliage-gleaners, mixed flocks and a whole bunch of birds, incredible morning. The afternoon was weter and quite slow. Carmo Road yielded a beautiful pair of Tufted Antshrike and a sudden flush of a juvenile Black Hawk Eagle. End of day with bad weather at the Pica-pau guesthouse, enjoying the fireplace and the garden birds.

October 19<sup>th</sup>. Our last day in Intervales was a quite bad rainy day, but amazingly with good results. The road to Bocaina provided a close pair of the rare endemic Blue-bellied Parrot, plus Rufous-tailed Attila, Plain Antvireo, White-collared and White-browed Foliage-gleaners, Planalto Woodcreeper, Sharp-billed Treehunter and Mottle-cheeked Tyrannulet. Later, we birded the road passing the restaurant, recording many of previously watched species like Slaty-breasted Wood Rail, Buff-fronted Foliage-gleaner and endemic Oustalet's Tyrannulet. The rain got stronger in the afternoon. We targeted Rusty-breasted Nunlet on trails next the research station, but without success. We managed views of Squamate Antbird, Wing-barred Piprites, Diademed and Azure-shouldered Tanagers, Green-billed Toucan, Black-capped Foliage-gleaner and a curious Capybara in a very dense forest stream.

We definitely had a great passage through São Paulo state, from Ubatuba in the north coast, then through the big São Paulo area to the most amazing Intervales State Park and a brief visit to the PETAR area. So many great places for biridng and so many excellent records achieved. Below some of the photographed birds (Eduardo Patrial):



October 20<sup>th</sup>. The day we left Intervales started early, at 4:30 am. The weather was fortunately better and we began the drive to the coast of Paraná state. Leaving Intervales, we flushed a male Long-trained Nightjar before dawn. As we missed Black-headed Berryeater in Espirito Santo, this time we included a quick new stop on our way south, the hills at PETAR (another state park) near Iporanga for it. There at lower elevation we managed eye-level long views of this uncommon and not much vocal Cotingidae. From there we continued driving until reaching the top of the Graciosa Road, where we made another quick stop at Rio do Corvo road, a nice site that provided us decent views of a pair Chestnut-backed Tanager and a responsive Slaty Bristlefront (the southern race). Lower at Graciosa, Azure Jay showed up nicely before a lunch in Morretes. Then another hour drive to reach Pontal do Sul for our usual boat trip in the Bay of Paranaguá, mainly for the local endemic Red-tailed Amazon. At the boat excursion we saw Brown Booby, too much Neotropic Cormorant, Kelp Gull, Royal Tern, Cocoi Heron, Yellow-crowned and Black-crowned Night Herons, Roseate Spoonbill, a good bunch of Scarlet Ibis, Pale-vented Pigeon and the gran finale, about a hundred Red-tailed Amazons coming to roost on the island in the end of the day. The boat trip back to Pontal was quite rough though, agitaded sea and some rainstorm. Overnight in guesthouse in Pontal do Sul.

October 21<sup>st</sup>. On this day, we left Pontal do Sul with a short drive and ferry across the Bay of Guaratuba, to reach the lovely Volta Velha Reserve in Itapoá, Santa Catarina state. We got to Volta Velha entrance road in good time, having a productive stop at the forest edge. There we saw very well the endemics Scaled Chachalaca, Restinga Tyrannulet and the even more restricted Kaempfer's Tody-Tyrant. Rufous-crowned Greenlet, Greenish Schiffornis, Violaceous Euphonia, Brazilian, Green-headed and Red-necked Tanagers were around. From there we entered the Reserve and the dense forest for the rest of morning. The clearing beside the river (Saí Mirim) was a great spot to see the stunning endemic Black-backed Tanager and few others that came really close to us - Red-necked Tanager, Green Honeycreeper, Violet Capped Woodnymph and a nice Rufous-margined Antwren. Azure Jays were also in the clearing. Track in the forest still provided great looks at Squamate Antbird and Black-capped Foliage-gleaner. Then by noon, we did our check in and went for lunch in town. In the afternoon, we visited the nice hills at Vila da Glória, achieving our main goal, the shy Rusty-breasted Nunlet. From there we visted our new site for Marsh Antwren, not far in the lowlands from Volta Velha Reserve. We got amazing views of male and female. Back to the reserve, we had an evening birding, where we got a female Scissor-tailed nightjar in the big clearing and later in dense forest, we closely heard the rare Silky-tailed Nightjar, unfortunately desappering after the firt calls back in response to playback. Overnight at Volta Velha.

October 22<sup>nd</sup>. With mission accomplished in the coastal lowlands, we left Itapoá early in the morning towards the Curitiba plateau, more precisely to Borda do Campo in São José dos Pinhais, where we arrived around eight am. There we first entered a gallery forest with Araucaria, a site where we got perfect views of the uncommon Canebrake Groundcreeper. Olive Spinetail also showed up well in the place. The large marsh beside still offered good views of Pampa Finch and Black-and-rufous Warbling Finch. From there we covered another area nearby for the rest of the morning, with more edge of forest and marshy habitats. We got Chimango Caracara, a stunning male Glaucous-blue Grosbeak and the australmost *Picumnus*, the adorable Mottled Piculet. In the afternoon, we repeated the area, going further in dense forest with bamboo, a site we managed simply great looks at the shy Speckle-breasted Antpitta (southern race). More from the forests from the area include close views of Hooded Berryeater and another pair Chestnut-backed Tanager. In the late afternoon, a marsh then provided decent views of Lesser Grass Finch and responses of the tricky endemic Marsh Tapaculo, which in one-second moment flew to another bush, allowing the client a brief and very lucky view. The birding was finished there in the avening with good observation of Long-tufted Screech Owl. Overnight next to the airport in São José dos Pinhais.


October 23<sup>rd</sup>. There was no birding that morning, this very successful Southeast Brazil Tour ended by late morning with the connecting flight to São Paulo.

Finishing this spectacular tour, states of Paraná and Santa Catarina provided the final selection of endemics and regional specialties (Eduardo Patrial):






