SOUTH INDIA & ANDAMAN ISLANDS TOUR REPORT 2022

19 November - 4 December 2022

Over 100 Indian Subcontinent endemics and near-endemics were seen, out of a trip total of 314 species, during our latest tour of these popular South Asian destinations, including a clean-sweep on South Andaman. Numerous highlights included Painted Bush Quail, Sri Lanka Frogmouth, Nilgiri and Andaman Wood Pigeons, Malabar Imperial Pigeon, Andaman Crake, Andaman Serpent-Eagle, Andaman Scops, Spot-bellied Eagle and Mottled Wood Owls, Malabar Flameback, Indian Pitta, White-bellied Minivet, White-bellied and Andaman Treepies, Indian Black-lored Tit, Yellow-throated Bulbul, Malabar Lark, Western Crowned and Booted Warblers, Nilgiri and Palani Laughingthrushes, Rufous Babbler, Nilgiri and White-bellied Blue Robins, Nilgiri Thrush, White-bellied, Rusty-tailed, Kashmir and Black-and-orange Flycatchers, Jerdon's Leafbird, and Nilgiri Pipit. The 20 species of mammal that we observed included Asian Elephant, a superb pack of Dhole, Blackbuck, the immense Gaur, and Nilgiri Tahr. Additionally, there were nearly 70 species of butterflies, nearly 20 dragonflies, and 12 reptiles.

Once we had all met-up at Port Blair Airport on South Andaman, we made our way to our hotel, tucked-in by the ocean, and prepared ourselves for the afternoons birding. We had four and a half days to find all the endemics here, so it made for comfortable birding. Much of our time was spent to the south of town, around Chidiyatapu. Exploring various areas of forest along the roadside and at the Biological Park, we found Andaman Coucal, Andaman Wood Pigeon, Andaman Green Pigeon, Andaman Woodpecker, Andaman Drongo, Andaman Treepie, Andaman Bulbul, White-headed Starling, Andaman Shama, and Andaman Flowerpecker, as well as the more wide-ranging Long-tailed Parakeet. At nightfall, we added Andaman Nightjar and Hume's and Andaman Boobooks. A short ferry ride was required to transport us to Khartang Reserved Forest, where Andaman Cuckoo-Dove, Andaman Crake and Andaman Cuckooshrike were all eventually tracked down. Andaman Serpent Eagle proved to be our trickiest endemic, but thanks to our driver, we had great views of one perched at nearby Mount Harriet; where Andaman Crake also showed much better. Three more endemic owls were found at more localised sites, and all showed well: Andaman Masked, Andaman Scops, and Walden's Scops (the latter still lumped in Oriental). Ograbraj Wetlands proved to be the best wetland location, with around 200 Andaman Teal, as well as many other interesting marsh and open country birds, such as Ruddy-breasted Crake, a range of migratory shorebirds, Indian (or Clamorous) Reed Warbler, Black-browed Reed and Pallas's Grasshopper Warblers, and Red-throated and Richard's Pipits.

The following morning, we flew back to Chennai and then onwards to Coimbatore, before driving up to our hotel in Ooty, in the Nilgiri Hills. Several hulking great Gaur were in the hotel grounds

that evening and had to be shooed-away by staff. We were up for dawn, birding the hotel environs and along the road nearby. Five Painted Bush Quails were well received, as were Nilgiri Laughingthrush, Indian Blackbird, the amazing Black-and-orange Flycatcher, and Nilgiri Blue Robin. At Ooty Lake, we found the smart White-spotted Fantail, and an unexpected male Kashmir Flycatcher. We descended the Nilgiris, and continued on to Jungle Hut, close to Mudumalai National Park, with Red-headed Vulture, Malabar Grey Hornbill, and Nilgiri Flowerpecker bagged en route. In the afternoon, we were led by excellent local guide Sidha around the Murugan Temple Hill area. An excellent variety of birds, in mixed habitats, included Indian Peafowl, Grey Francolin, Indian Swiftlet, Brown-capped Pygmy and Yellow-crowned Woodpeckers, Black-rumped Flameback, a pair of White-naped Woodpeckers, Plum-headed Parakeet, Indian Pitta, Orange Minivet, Black-headed Cuckooshrike, White-bellied Drongo, Malabar Lark, Hill Swallow, Yellow-billed Babbler, Indian Nuthatch, Malabar Starling, Indian Robin, Purple-rumped Sunbird, and White-browed Wagtail. After nightfall, he somehow managed to show us four species of nightjar (Jungle, Jerdon's, Indian and Savanna) without using playback, and we also lucked-in on a superb pack of Dhole and a group of Blackbuck.

We still had a full day and a morning to explore various sites around Jungle Hut, and the outskirts of Mudumalai NP. Our local guides knew all the good places and we had a very successful birding experience. Oriental Scops, Spot-bellied Eagle and Brown Fish Owls were all seen well in daytime, and Sudheesh managed to find us the tricky Nilgiri Thrush. We also added Red Spurfowl, Grey Junglefowl, Jungle Bush Quail, Blue-faced Malkoha, Yellow-wattled Lapwing, White-rumped Vulture, White-cheeked Barbet, Streak-throated Woodpecker, a rather too brief pair of White-bellied Minivets, Indian Paradise Flycatcher, Jerdon's Bush Lark, wintering Booted Warbler and Hume's Whitethroat, Indian Scimitar Babbler, Brown-cheeked Fulvetta, Indian Blue Robin, Malabar Whistling Thrush, and Jerdon's Leafbird (after a lot of effort!).

We returned to Ooty for another overnight stay, before continuing our journey southwards to Munnar in the High Range, crossing the Kerala border in the process. Large Grey Babbler and Jacobin Cuckoo were noted en route and, once at the outskirts of town, we birded some patches of roadside forest near some tea-stalls. Nilgiri Wood Pigeon, Yellow-browed Bulbul, Brown-breasted Flycatcher, Blue-capped Rock Thrush and Western Crowned Warbler were among the species that popped up. The next morning, in order to visit Eravikulam National Park, we rode up a narrow road in and official park bus along with other visitors. Despite our best efforts we weren't to be the first on the scene, and visitors are now only allowed to walk along the road at the top. Fortunately, this did not prevent us from finding some of our targets. At the top level, despite the hordes, we had good views of the endemic Nilgiri Tahr, Palani Laughingthrush, Malabar Whistling Thrush, and Nilgiri Flycatcher. Further afield, in the vicinity of Lockhart Gap, we finally found the much-wanted Nilgiri Pipit and White-bellied Blue Robin, as well as Dusky Crag Martin and Southern Hill Myna.

The following morning saw us winding our way downhill towards our hotel close to Periyar National Park. A site for the restricted-range Yellow-throated Bulbul was visited along the way. The birds were hard to find here, and it was seeming like a waste of time, until Heidi miraculously spotted a pair quietly feeding in some bushes. Our first Loten's Sunbirds were also seen. At Periyar, we had a day and a half to find the specialities. Exploring various trails at the edge of the park with our allotted guide, during both afternoons, we enjoyed Grey-fronted Green Pigeon, Jungle Owlet, Malabar Barbet, Blue-winged Parakeet, and White-bellied Treepie, as well as Jungle and the more localised Rufous Babblers. Elephants are an ever-present delight and danger here, and we were lucky enough to encounter some working their way through a patch of bamboo.

Further afield at Thekkady Boat Landing, the very knowledgeable Raj Kumar guided us for the morning. Thanks to his skills we found Malabar Imperial Pigeon, Chestnut-winged Cuckoo, Forktailed Drongo-Cuckoo, Malabar Trogon, Malabar Grey Hornbill, Malabar Woodshrike, Indian Black-lored Tit, and White-bellied Blue and Rusty-tailed Flycatchers.

From Periyar, we took the back roads to our final destination at Thattekad, currently perhaps the best-known and birdiest place in the south. On the way there, we birded along the excellent Neriamangalam Painavu Road, and we were to make several return visits here. Highlights in the roadside forest included Red Spurfowl, Malabar Flameback, Indian Golden Oriole, the tricky Greyheaded Bulbul (but fleetingly), Flame-throated Bulbul, Dark-fronted and Rufous Babblers, and Crimson-backed Sunbird. Around Thattekad itself, we were guided to a number of sub-locations in search of our various specialty targets, with this year's haul highlighted by Sri Lanka Frogmouth, Mottled Wood Owl, Grey-headed Bulbul (again fleetingly), and Black-throated Munia.

Our time in South India ended the following morning, as we drove the relatively short distance to Kochi (Cochin) Airport and connected with our onward flights home.
